

Everett Wiles is a media professional with more than 30 years experience in television production, higher education and media management. His media career started in the early nineteen nineties when he was an integral contributor to the establishment of a media department at West Indies College now Northern Caribbean University (NCU). He went to New York by the mid-nineties where he completed his Bachelor of Arts degree with Honors (1999) and a Master of Arts degree with distinction (2000) in Communication Arts from the New York Institute of Technology.

In 2000 he returned to NCU and rejoined the media team to continue building the media department there. In 2003 when the Department of English and Modern Languages was reshaped and the Department of Communication Studies was established, Mr. Wiles was asked to be the academic chair.

In 2009 Mr. Wiles was asked to serve as the General Manager of the NCU Media Group, a newly formed media entity set up to oversee the operations of the university's all island radio station NCU FM, its all-island cable channel NCU TV and its media production unit. In 2017 he migrated to the USA where he served as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Visual Art Communication and Design at Andrews University in Berrien Springs, Michigan, overseeing the television specialization as well as supervising the television production studio.

Mr Wiles currently serves as the Vice President of Integrated Marketing and Communication at Washington Adventist University (WAU) (formerly Columbia Union College) based in Takoma Park, MD. Before joining the workforce at WAU, Mr. Wiles served as overall producer for the "3AM: Morning is Coming" production for the HOPE Channel International.
